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What were you like as a child? How did your parents, family, friends, or siblings describe you? What details do you recall (favorite activities, biggest struggles, etc...)?

What is something that took a long time to transform in your life? What helped you stay focused on *allowing it to be transformed*, instead of giving up or quitting?

Read Revelation 22:1-5. Notice John's vision in Revelation 22 restores symbols from Genesis 1–3 (river, tree of life, God's presence). What does this full-circle narrative reveal about the consistency of God's mission from beginning to end?

What does the Imago Dei teach us about the "end times?"

The Tree of Life disappears after Genesis 3 and then reappears at the end of Revelation. Why is the Tree of Life such a powerful theological symbol for the Imago Dei and for human flourishing?

Revelation 22:4 says, "They will see His face." This is something no one in Scripture has been allowed to do (Exodus 33:20). What does it reveal about the level of intimacy and restoration God intends for redeemed humanity? What does that teach us about who God is?

What are some of the main takeaways you have from this entire series, *The Imago Dei*? How has your faith grown as a result?

Revelation 22 shows God restoring the world, not discarding it. What is one tangible way you can join God's restoring work in your family, neighborhood, or workplace this week?

What rhythms can you add to your daily routine to help you remain hopeful in the promise of the Imago Dei's restoration? (How do you behold Jesus, daily?)

Now that you are aware of the Imago Dei, and your place within it, how would you like your life be different moving forward?
