Where in your life do you feel the strongest sense of being fully known and fully loved? What makes that relationship sacred?

How has fear of being known ever affected your ability to connect deeply with others?

In what ways have you seen our culture replace genuine intimacy with consumption?

Can you think of a time when you experienced a moment of "holy ground" in a friendship, marriage, or community setting; When sacred life met sacred life?

Paul wrote that "your bodies are temples of the Holy Spirit." What does that say about how God values our physical and relational lives?

"In Corinth, intimacy became consumption; in Christ, intimacy is communion." How does that contrast shape your view of holiness?

How does Jesus' life (especially His friendships and the way He loved people) **reveal** what divine intimacy looks like?

What does it mean that intimacy itself is a reflection of the Imago Dei? How does that deepen your understanding of what it means to be human?

Who in your life might need to experience the kind of intimacy Jesus modeled (presence, empathy, etc.) and how could you offer that?

Where in your relationships might you need to add or restore a boundary to protect intimacy rather than hinder it?
