5. **Read John 1:14 and 1 John 2:6.** Why is the incarnation essential to Christian faith? What could happen if Christianity were reduced to spiritual ideas without the embodied life of Jesus as our example and measure?
6. **Read 1 John 2:1-2 and Hebrews 4:14-16.** What does it mean that Jesus is our advocate? How can Jesus be both the measure of our lives and the source of mercy when we fall short?
7. Consider the different areas of your life: home, work, church, friendships, etc... Is there an area where a gap may be forming between what you claim to believe and how you are living? Share only what feels appropriate.
8. What is one practice our LifeGroup can adopt to become a community where people feel safe enough to be honest and are consistently met with truth, grace, and prayer?
