What does it mean to "carry God's signature in one's life?" How does that shape the way we feel about; God? Neighbors? And ourselves?

When you think about Jesus' ministry (touching the untouchable, centering children, dignifying the overlooked), which story of Jesus best illustrates the sanctity of life to you personally? Why that one?

Who is someone in your life that is hard for you to see as "fearfully and wonderfully made"? What gets in the way of seeing God's image in them?

If the way of Jesus is not where we stand as Christians, but with whom we stand as God's Image, with whom is God inviting you to stand with in your life?
